#### Frequently asked questions about the Support Service Fund:

##### What is the Support Service Fund?

The Support Service Fund provides financial assistance for breast health or breast cancer-related services or items to underserved people throughout Maine. Since the fund was established in 2000, the Maine Breast Cancer Coalition (MBCC) has awarded grants in all counties of Maine ranging from less than \$25 to \$900 to more than 1,000 low-income, uninsured, or underinsured people who didn't qualify for, or whose particular needs weren't covered by other assistance programs.

##### What kinds of services or items does the fund cover?

The Fund covers a wide range of items and services. It has covered breast imaging (mammography or ultrasound), chemotherapy, radiation, lab/pathology fees, radiologist readings, physician/surgeon, hospital bills, lymphedema compression garments, prescriptions, genetic testing, prostheses/bras, wigs/turbans, travel expenses to treatments, and temporary emergency living expenses for people in breast cancer treatment, to list a few.

##### How is the Support Service Fund different than other charitable assistance programs?

The Fund is unique in that it meets the applicant at her or his point of need. The Support Service Committee reviews each request carefully. The items or services requested, financial need, and required documentation are all considered according to established criteria and individual situations. During the application process, MBCC often directs applicants to existing programs that will cover their needs. But in many cases, the Support Service Fund is truly a program of "last resort", for those who have nowhere else to turn.

##### What portion of my contribution will go to grant recipients?

Our low administrative costs are covered through a grant from one of our major donors, so *100% of individual donations go to grant recipients.*

##### Are donations to the Fund tax-deductible?

Yes. Maine Breast Cancer Coalition is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization.

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#### Examples of how donations to the Support Service Fund have been allocated:

\$25 donation will cover:

- one or two turbans, hats, or scarves for a chemotherapy patient
- one physician visit co-pay

\$50 donation will cover:

- clinical breast exam
- payment for 150 miles of travel to and from treatments

\$100 donation will cover:

- physician copays for nearly a week of radiation treatments
- payment for 300 miles of travel to and from treatments

\$250 donation will cover:

- mammogram (average cost)
- lymphedema gauntlet or sleeve (compression garment)

#### Examples of Support Service Fund Recipients:

A 60 year-old woman from Oxford county, who needed lymphedema (side effect of breast cancer surgery) compression garments not covered by her insurance. Awarded \$298.62.

A 39-year-old from Kennebec county with metastatic breast cancer had to stop working and was on disability, but was not able to afford expenses for a trip to Boston for a second opinion. Awarded \$300 for travel expenses.

A 50 year-old from Aroostook county was awarded \$337.34 for a prosthesis and two mastectomy bras. She has no insurance and doesn't qualify for MaineCare. Maine Breast and Cervical Health Program, for which she qualifies, does not cover the items.

A 30-year-old from Somerset county was awarded \$350 for genetic testing. Many of her relatives had died from breast cancer and her mother had been diagnosed at age 37. She has MaineCare, but it does not cover the testing.
